You know you've got huge potential to succeed, you want to do a BA or a BA conjoint degree and you're from a decile 1–4 school in Auckland. This one's for you:

Faculty of Arts Auckland Schools Scholarship

Note: If you apply for a school leaver scholarship (top four on the left) you will automatically be considered for this scholarship as well.

Opens: 21 February

Closes: 4 April

up to \$4,000 pa, up to two years

You're a NZ-born woman student enrolled full-time in a BA or BA conjoint degree, who has completed at least one year of study.

Grace Kay Award

Application on entry

up to \$5,000

You want to study for a BA, BGlobalSt or conjoint degree and you've applied for a University of Auckland School Leaver / First Year Scholarship. Your application will automatically get you considered for this scholarship, it's that easy!
