The University would like to retain the majority of the changes made for 2022 as business as usual for 2023. Some of the changes would be continued for another year and then reviewed to assess their impact. In addition, some new changes had been identified that would be required for 2023. Therefore, a new Omnibus Amendment Statute 2023 had been developed to capture all changes. The new statute, replacing the current Omnibus Amendment Statute, would be in force from 1 January 2023 until 31 December 2023.
