For staff and students who have a print disability at The University of Auckland.

Print Disability

The Copyright Act 1994, Section 69 (4) states: 'For the purposes of this section, a person has a print disability if he or she'

- Is blind.
- Is unable to focus or move his or her eyes.
- Is unable to hold or manipulate books.
- Suffers severe impairments of his or her sight.
- Suffers a handicap with respect to visual perception.

We offer:

- Narration into audio formats.
- Scanning and editing into WORD documents.
- Conversion of PDF documents to other formats.
- Retention of original layout if required.
- Simplification of layout to suit screen readers.

The following items may be transcribed:

- Text books.
- Journal articles.
- Theses.
- Course materials.
- Selections from library books.

Delivery methods:

- E formats by email attachment.
- Completed E items on CD- ROMs.
