2025 Course Limitations – Arts

Pursuant to the Limitation of Entry Statute 1991, the relevant Dean proposes the following limits to the maximum number of students who can be enrolled in its courses in 2025 because of an insufficiency of accommodation or staff to provide adequate teaching to all students expected to seek a place.

- 1. Identified courses with specific prerequisite academic standards and/or other selection criteria: Students will be selected for enrolment into the following courses, up to the specified maximum number of places available, on the basis of the selection criteria prescribed below.
- 2. Identified courses without specific prerequisite academic standards or other selection criteria: Students will be selected for enrolment into the following courses, up to the specified maximum number of places available, on a first in, first enrolled basis.
- **3.** All other scheduled courses: All other scheduled courses offered by the Faculty shall also be deemed to be limited due to an insufficiency of accommodation. The limit will be determined by the maximum capacity of the room(s) allocated to the class(es) associated with each course through the University's timetable process in accordance with the Academic Timetable Policy. Where laboratory sessions or compulsory tutorials are scheduled, the ability to accommodate these sessions for the course or the overall enrolment number will be the limiting factor, depending on which presents the tightest constraint. It is not possible to set the numerical limits for these courses in advance, but the University will seek to accommodate as many students as possible. Students will be selected for enrolment on a first in, first enrolled basis, until the maximum capacity has been reached. Oversight of the process will be provided by the Associate Dean (Academic) in the first instance.
