Frequently asked questions

Who can I talk to about parenting and work?

Members of the CPC Consultative Group are available to discuss questions you may have about combining your work and parenting responsibilities.

What resources are available for breastfeeding on campus?

The Equity Office has mini-fridges available to loan for storing expressed milk. There are also breastfeeding spaces at the City, Epsom, Grafton, Newmarket and Tāmaki campuses.

Are men entitled to parental leave?

Partners and fathers (including those in same-sex relationships) may be eligible for Unpaid Parental Leave, University Paid Parental Leave and Government Paid Parental Leave. Parental Leave is the time taken off work to care for a newborn or an adopted child under the age of five.
