Programme Overview

Covering a range of courses, including te ao Māori perspectives, diversity and inclusion, human development, educational psychology, child development and professional communication and practice, you will develop an expert understanding of the complex and vital early years of children's lives.

This is an excellent foundation degree. It will prepare you for a career in a range of educational settings including policy development and leadership roles in New Zealand and overseas.

This partnership with Taylors University allows students studying the Bachelor of Education (Hons) at Taylor's University to transfer either to the Bachelor of Education (TESOL) or the Bachelor of Early Childhood Studies offered at the University of Auckland after just one year**.

SEGi College (Subang Jaya), Malaysia

This partnership will support graduates of the Diploma in Early Childhood Education offered at SEGi College Subang Jaya to enter directly into the second year of the University of Auckland's Bachelor Early Childhood Studies degree programme**.

Shanghai Normal University, China

Our partnership with Shanghai Normal University will enable Bachelor of Education (Pre-school Education) students at Shanghai Normal University to enter directly into the second year of the Bachelor of Early Childhood Studies programme after just one and a half years**.

Further Study

This programme provides a strong disciplinary pathway into a graduate teaching qualification or postgraduate research in the field of early childhood studies.

If you decide to pursue a teaching career in New Zealand, you can gain registration by adding a one-year Graduate Diploma in Teaching (Early Childhood Education) or Graduate Diploma in Teaching (Primary). Alternatively, graduates of this programme could also consider a number of different masters programmes at the University, including a Master of Education or Master of Arts.

Bachelor of Education (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages)–BEd(TESOL)

Gain expertise in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages by studying at our world-ranked Faculty of Arts and Education. Here you will have the opportunity to turn your passion for English into language-teaching skills so that your students can participate as global citizens. This programme is suitable for students of any first language. As a minimum requirement, applicants must hold an acceptable University Entrance qualification and be able to provide evidence of their proficiency in English.

Programme Overview

Practical experience is integral to this programme. You will take part in two supervised practical experiences where you will observe TESOL teaching in a range of settings in Auckland, one of the most diverse cities in the world.

You will gain a practical foundation in subjects that inform TESOL education, such as psychology, philosophy, sociology and history, while developing skills in learning, teaching and assessment. This programme will be useful for education leaders and policymakers as well as TESOL teachers.


