You will examine how media engage with cultural, political and ecological issues. You will discuss the ever-changing world on our screens and how people use media.

Our graduates pursue careers in film and media production, distribution, advertising, broadcasting, marketing, public relations, curating, archiving, and journalism. Media and Screen Studies enables you to develop the core skills needed for a vast variety of media-related roles internationally.

Throughout your study, you will explore everything from comics to popular music, from mockumentaries to filmmaking. You will learn about social media, how to write stories for screen and explore our relationship with visual culture. To enrol in Stage II, you will need to take both MEDIA 101 Film Studies and MEDIA 102 Media and Culture, which explore fundamental concepts of Media and Screen Studies.

#### **STAGE 1 COURSE\***

## MEDIA 102 - Media and Culture

Studying the cultural significance of media, including social media, video games, comics, popular music, advertising, television and films. Analysing meanings and experiences of media texts, genres and formats. Discussing how audiences and users interact with media. Articulating the powers and pleasures of media in cultural contexts. Examining media industries and technological change. Creating critical interventions in media practice.

## **STAGE 2 COURSE\***

## **MEDIA 221 - Action Films**

Investigates action films as a genre and a "spectacle" in world cinema. Considers the aesthetic qualities of the genre and its interaction with the wider context. Issues studied include the relationship between conventions and inventions, the combination of visual and aural spectacle, as well as how identity is articulated through the discourse of nation, gender, ethnicity, age and the landscape.

#### **STAGE 3 COURSE\***

## MEDIA 340 - Filmmaking

A hands-on exploration of the aesthetic and technical challenges of cinematic storytelling. Students are encouraged to reflect on filmmakers' creative strategies and pursue their own choices in relation to camera, sound, lighting and editing. This course involves a blend of lectures and studio-based workshops and emphasises the links between cinematic ideas and the practical techniques used to realise them.
