## **STAGE 1 COURSE\* EDUC 100 - The Creative Process**

Theories and practices of creativity will be examined and practically explored through a variety of disciplines, such as the arts, biology, psychology, sociology, philosophy and education. What is creativity? Can creativity be learnt? What happens in the brain when we are creative? These are some of the questions addressed in this course.

# **STAGE 2 COURSE\* EDUC 201 - History** of Education

An examination of the nature of historical inquiry with reference to Aotearoa New Zealand's educational past; questions why education has been analysed largely as something planned rather than something experienced and introduces oral history as methodology. Selected aspects of the educational histories of other countries will be discussed for comparative analysis.
