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What postgraduate study is right for you?

Postgraduate certificates (PGCert) and diplomas (PGDip)

Postgraduate certificates and diplomas are a good choice if you want to do further study in an area you're interested in without doing a research project and/or you'd like to study part-time over a longer period and want a more flexible route to enrol in a one-year masters degree.

PGCert:

A PGCert is a shorter, more focused postgraduate qualification that provides a focused introduction to a subject. Most postgraduate certificates are designed to be 60 points, which represents a focused programme of study.

PGDip:

PGDips are a longer, more in-depth option. Most postgraduate diplomas are designed to be completed in one year of full-time study, requiring 120 points. Some programmes allow for part-time completion, often over two years.

Masters

A masters degree offers a range of options and is a good choice if you want to dive deep into a specialist area, contribute to knowledge in your field or upgrade your skills and expertise. The majority of our masters programmes offer both a taught pathway (more classes, smaller dissertation research project) and a research pathway (larger thesis research project) and are offered as a 120-point degree or 180-point degree.

A 120-point masters typically requires one year of full-time study, while a 180-point masters usually requires 1.5 years of full-time study. The point value also reflects the workload and the amount of material covered.

The 180-point programme is designed for students who may not have the specific prior qualifications for the 120-point programme or who prefer a longer, more in-depth study experience.

Doctorate

A PhD (Doctor of Philosophy) gives you the opportunity to take on independent and original research, supervised by academic experts and research leaders. You'll network and collaborate with a wide range of figures in your field, and it can be the beginning of an academic research career path.

Build the skills and knowledge to lead equitable, high-quality learning for all students while boosting your career and earning potential.

Postgraduate Diploma in Educational Leadership

Develop the knowledge and skills that aspiring and current educational leaders need to meet the demands of modern and diverse educational settings.

Professional Supervision

Postgraduate Certificate in Professional Supervision

If you wish to gain the theoretical insights and practical leadership knowledge to improve the quality of education and leadership in schools and centres and advance outcomes for students, then these courses are for you.

Educational Policy and Organisations

EDPROFST 739

Enhances your understanding of the education policy process at both national and local levels, while building the critical skills and leadership capacity needed to interpret and influence policy effectively.







Perfect for advancing to leadership roles. Understanding policy equips educators and administrators with the insight needed to step into leadership positions where influencing or implementing policy is a key responsibility.

STEM Education in Years 0-8

FDCURRIC 723

Helps you build quality STEM practice in your class or school through a series of assignments. You will build a resource of localised STEM activities relating to your school, as well as showing you a process that can be applied in the future.





Contemporary Pedagogies

EDCURRIC 700

Explore a range of contemporary pedagogies, including digital learning, dialogic teaching, culturally sustaining approaches, inquiry-based learning, and transdisciplinary education, through lectures, discussion, reading, and reflection.







Curriculum Theory, Issues, Practice FDPROFST 777

Explore curriculum through a variety of educational theories, with a special focus on sociological perspectives.





Special Topic: Curriculum Changes in Aotearoa FDCURRIC 725

Designed for education professionals working with or in schools to address issues of curriculum implementation and policy. Throughout the course you will examine how Matauranga Māori has informed curriculum documents while also critically exploring international curriculum documents to compare.





Perfect for driving educational innovation and leading curriculum development. Professionals with expertise in both areas of pedagogy and curriculum are well positioned to take on roles such as curriculum coordinators, instructional designers, or subject leads, guiding the creation and implementation of innovative programmes.

Language and literacy

Literacy and language skills are an essential way of accessing. evaluating and generating knowledge. These courses are relevant for all teachers who want to be critical consumers of literacy and language research, designers for accelerated learning and formative evaluators of effective practices and resources.

Bilingual Education

FDPROF 707

Research has shown the importance of building on learners' funds of knowledge and home language practices as they develop ways of using the dominant societal language. You will explore how policy and practice align with this research finding, while emphasising the important role of educators as advocates for social and linguistic justice.







Language Learning Needs

EDPROF 705

You will learn about several theories related to second language acquisition, while acknowledging the role of first/heritage languages and culture. You will be introduced to a range of strategies to support your multilingual learners and can trial some of those in the classroom.







Language Focused Curriculum

FDPROF 722

Expands on key concepts introduced in EDPROF 705, particularly in relation to second language acquisition theory. You will be given the opportunity to critique specific educational contexts and to propose solutions leading to more effective learning for linguistically diverse learners.







Perfect for leading curriculum development. Postgraduate training allows educators to contribute to or lead the development: of literacy and language curricula that are current, research-based, and responsive to student needs.



Children's Literature in Education

EDPROFST 707

Extend your knowledge of children's literature for teaching critical analysis, storytelling and reading for pleasure. You will become a critical reader and analyser of both children's and young adult literature and will use these skills to consider literature programmes relevant for New Zealand children's literacy learning.





Language analysis for teachers

EDPROFST 706

Designed to help teachers understand how the English language is constructed at the level of sound, word and text. It is essential for any teacher who needs to support the academic and language development of their learners.





Perfect for addressing diverse student needs. Postgraduate study focussing on languages and literacy equips educators with the tools to support students from various linguistic, cultural, and socioeconomic backgrounds and can help improve literacy outcomes for all learners.

Inclusivity and collaboration

Better meet the diverse needs of all students and help create a supportive, respectful classroom environment with these courses that enable you to dive deep into different learning styles, cultural backgrounds, abilities and adaptive teaching strategies.

Collaboration and Inclusive Practices

EDPROF 732

How can learners, whanau, teachers, teacher aides and other professionals work effectively together to support the learning and belonging of a diverse range of students in early childhood centres and schools? Working collaboratively with fellow students, you will critically examine how people can work effectively together to enhance the outcomes of diverse learners in complex education settings.













Ako: Learning to Learn and Teaching to Learn

EDPROF 737

Critically examines strategies that support responsive teaching, effective learning and the development of self-regulating learners and teachers. For teachers in any educational setting who are looking to draw on their own experiences and deepen their understanding of learners, learning and teaching.







Māori and Indigenous Research

FDUC 787

An examination of how best to approach research with, by and for Māori, Pasifika and other indigenous groups, this course has relevance for all researchers in the education, community and social service sectors. This is an approved Research Methods course, which is a prerequisite for enrolling in postgraduate research (a dissertation or thesis).





Re-claiming Pasifika Education

EDUC 709

A critique of education policy, practice and research as experienced by Pasifika communities throughout Aotearoa New Zealand. Pasifika pedagogical frameworks and research approaches are examined in terms of underlying knowledges, philosophies and discourses and how these might position teachers and researchers in partnership with Pasifika communities, to enhance outcomes for Pasifika learners.





Inclusive Practices for Neurodiversity

EDUC 759

Provides an opportunity to critically examine concepts and ideas relating to neurodiversity and their implications for and application to education policy, teaching practice, and approaches to learning support.







Perfect for driving educational innovation. Those equipped with knowledge on diverse learner needs are better able to experiment with new models of teaching, such as project-based learning, blended learning, or culturally responsive teaching, and become leaders of change in their schools or institutions.



Further learning for a modern classroom

Delve into special educational topics like transformative change and educational psychology through these courses and sharpen the skills you need to lead and inspire today's students in tomorrow's classrooms.

Special Topic: Mental Health and Wellbeing in Schools **FDCURRIC 721**

How do we ensure that schools are wellbeing and mana-enhancing for children and youth? This course is an advanced examination of the theory and practice of mental health education, wellbeing and hauora in education settings.





Special Topic: Gender, Sexuality and Education EDCURRIC 730

Rangatahi (youth) in Aotearoa who identify as sex, gender and/or sexuality diverse are present across all schools. This course explores policy, curriculum and pedagogical approaches that can support the inclusion, wellbeing and achievement of these learners.





Educational Psychology

EDUC 741

Facilitates critical engagement with current research in educational psychology. Participants will develop a deeper understanding of how cognitive, motivational and social factors relate to student learning and outcomes.







Digital Interventions for Learning

EDCURRIC 740

Through practical experience in applying your learning, you will critically examine the latest theories, research, and practices in using digital tools as interventions to support struggling learners.





Perfect for preparing for advanced roles: Postgraduate study opens doors to roles beyond classroom teaching, such as education consultancy, research, or leadership.
