WHY STUDY PSYCHOLOGY?

Are you fascinated by human behaviour? Do you wonder what motivates us? What about how we learn?

Psychology as a BA major enables you to study how people think, feel and behave. You will learn how the brain works, how children develop, and how people interact with their world. You can explore aspects of behaviour and wellbeing, such as how people cope with stressful life events. You can also study human personality and intelligence, and people's experiences of mental illness.

Study the mind and behaviour in this varied and intriguing subject.

CAREER POSSIBILITIES

Many avenues open up to graduates with a degree in Psychology. Building your knowledge about relationships, neuroscience, as well as human behaviour, thinking, reasoning, emotion, mental health, language development, perception and personality means you may have an advantage in the job market, due to your understanding of psychological theory and practice.

As a graduate, you may find a position in a business, health service, or in a research institute.

Your job could include developing psychological tests, statistical analyses, or surveys and questionnaires, as well as being involved in staff recruitment, personnel training and evaluation.



WHAT CAN I STUDY?

You will learn to investigate how people think, learn, perceive, feel, interact with one another, and understand yourself. You will study different sources of psychology knowledge, including learning from animal behaviour, and you'll learn how to gather and analyse observable and repeatable behavioural data, in the laboratory or out in the world.

Stage 1 Course*



Topics covered may include: developmental and social psychology including group behaviour, the measurement of mental abilities, intelligence, models of personality, clinical and health psychology, methods of therapeutic intervention, and the psychological similarities and differences between cultures. A laboratory component, in which students are required to participate as subjects, forms part of the course.

Stage 2 Course*

PSYCH 207 - Theories of Personality and Development

The major personality theories are presented including: Behavioural, Cognitive, Social-Cognitive, Psychodynamic, Humanistic/Phenomenological, Trait/ Dispositional and Biological/Evolutionary. The hypotheses generated by these theories, about development from early childhood onwards and about 'normal' and 'abnormal' behaviour, will be discussed and evaluated in terms of empirical evidence and utility. Attention will be paid to cultural issues of relevance in a New Zealand context.

Stage 3 Course*

PSYCH 319 - Psychology and Gender

The study of gender is crucial to understanding many everyday aspects of our lives, as well as many contemporary social issues. This course provides an introduction to selected key issues in the critical psychology of gender, from a social constructionist perspective. Topics that will be covered include gendered bodies, masculinity and femininity, sexuality, rape, and mental health.
