PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

Gain an internationally recognised degree from the only New Zealand University to rank in the top 40 in the world for Education as a subject* and enter a profession where the demand for graduates is high in New Zealand and overseas.

Our practical programme has been refreshed, giving you the freedom and opportunity to choose courses from other disciplines across the University, enabling you to develop essential critical and ethical thinking, communication, and collaborative skills.

Courses are taught through a range of methods including face-to-face and online lectures, along with in-person tutorials and workshops. This is a highly hands-on programme which includes practicum (school placements) from your first year of study.

Our teaching staff and academics are experts in their fields with a strong passion for supporting the next generation of teachers. You will graduate equipped with the tools you need to teach in modern classrooms where building strong relationships is vital, diversity is celebrated, and digital learning is key.

Bachelor of Education (Teaching) students are eligible for the external TeachNZ Scholarships with applications open in September each year.

PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

If you already hold a bachelors degree (or higher), a Graduate Diploma in Teaching will prepare you for a rewarding career you'll love.

Choose between Early Childhood Education where you can make an impact on young children's lives from birth to 5-years old, inspire Primary school children from ages 5- to 13-years, choose the Secondary pathway, or the Maori-medium, and shape the minds of young adults aged from 13-to 18-years.

FLEXIBLE LEARNING

If you need study flexibility to fit around your schedule, our Online Graduate Diploma in Teaching could be the option for you. You will have on-demand access to the programme material, and your teachers will be on hand to support you throughout your studies. Whether you are studying in-person or online, we will support you all the way.

PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE

You will be based in schools or centres throughout the year with other University students, forming supportive, tightknit relationships with each other, and with professional teachers who are experts in their fields.

Introducing our new Graduate Diploma in Teaching (Māori-medium)

Our new Graduate Diploma is designed for those with an undergraduate degree and high proficiency te reo Māori. The programme, delivered through te reo Māori, will provide you with:

- High proficiency te reo Māori pedagogical language knowledge across curriculum areas.
- STEM subject expertise.
- Extensive field-based experience alongside worldleading research-informed curricula.
- Eligibility for provisional practicing certificate for teaching in Kaupapa Māori, Māori-medium and Englishmedium settings at primary and secondary levels.
- High employability with a clear trajectory into curriculum and school leadership.

Combining the flexibility of online learning with practical placements, and complimented by wānanga, you will benefit from being part of a school community, learning alongside experienced teachers, immersing yourself in school activities, and building knowledge of effective teaching practices through observation and participation in the classroom.

The programme is designed to equip you with a comprehensive knowledge and skill set for teaching across various contexts. You will explore holistic and relational leadership based on Māori values and practices that foster the success of mokopuna (learners in schools) through the Tū Rangatira Māori-medium educational leadership framework.

NOHO-Ā-KURA (PRACTICUM)

You will complete two practicums over the year, one of which will be at a host school, with a second placement at another participating school. Working alongside experienced associate teachers, you will gradually assume more teaching responsibilities and grow your confidence in applying evidence-based approaches to refine your teaching practice.

This programme is a unique chance for you to bring together education excellence and cultural excellence/desire to contribute to your community while staying employed while you study and being immersed in a te reo Māori environment.





"The Teacher Education in Schools programme has helped prepare me for a career in teaching by allowing me the opportunity to be in a host school full-time and build meaningful, respectful, and engaging relationships with my fellow colleagues and students. I have been fortunate enough to have been matched with Tangaroa College as my host school this year and the experience has been nothing short of inspirational. The Waipapa Taumata Rau, University of Auckland Teacher Education in Schools Programme (TESP) is part of the Ministry of Education's School Onsite Training Programme.

You will spend three days a week embedded in a host school, where you will experience day-to-day school life, while simultaneously completing your Graduate Diploma in Teaching (Primary) Online or Graduate Diploma in Teaching (Secondary)* Online, with a second placement during the year at another participating school.

The programme offers flexibility of online learning as well as benefiting from being part of a school community, learning alongside experienced teachers, involvement in school activities, and building knowledge of effective teaching practices through observation and participation in the classroom.

If you want to make a difference in the lives of ākonga, become a teacher and get paid to learn on the job before entering an exciting and rewarding career.




