Research Integrity and Good Research Practice

Guidance on Good Research Practice and how to implement the Research Integrity Policy has been developed by the UoA Research Integrity Officer, <u>Dr Elizabeth Visser</u>, with input from Faculty Research Integrity Advisors. The Good Research Practice link on <u>Research Hub</u> is organised in five sections: Introduction to good research practice, Research misconduct and questionable research practices, Authorship and publication, Notebook keeping & GenAl in research practice, and Conflict of interest.

Two online workshops are being held in October to discuss research integrity issues and share tools for navigating through the complexity of these topics – details can be found in the final section of this Update.

Visiting Scholars Programme

In the September 2025 round, the Faculty Research Committee reviewed four and approved two applications for our Visiting Scholars Programme. The Department of Economics will host Prof Francis Bloch from the Paris School of Economics, Université Paris, with Assoc Prof Steffen Lippert serving as the lead host. The Department of Marketing will welcome Prof Murali K. Mantrala from the University of Kansas School of Business, with Dr Tim Kalwey acting as the lead host. The two visits will take place in 2026. In both cases, there will be sessions relevant to researchers across the Business School.

Reset, Re-Imagine, Reframe: Call for Applications for Universitas 21 Mid-Career Researcher Programme

Mid-career researchers (MCRs) are invited to apply to participate in the online <u>U21 MCR Programme</u> from 20 February to 19 March 2026 (2-5 hours/week). U21's definition of a MCR is someone "at the level of Senior Lecturer or Associate Professor (or equivalent)"; however, there is scope for the organiser to be flexible with this definition.

The programme aims to inspire, equip, empower, and connect MCRs so they can respond to both their current and future challenges with confidence and courage.
