#### Welcome to the New Zealand Economics Competition 2023 Awards presentation ceremony.

The New Zealand Economics Competition has grown in size and reputation since its inception in 1997 and has been administered by the Department of Economics at The University of Auckland Business School since 2008.

The Competition is the largest and most prestigious one of its kind for secondary school students. The fifty-minute examination paper contains fifty multiple-choice questions that test both classroom theory and general knowledge of current economic issues.

This year about 2000 students from 56 schools throughout New Zealand entered the Competition. Tonight is an opportunity to recognise some of the students who have achieved outstanding performances.

We also wish to express our gratitude to the teachers and principals, without whose contribution the Competition would not be possible.

#### **Guest speakers**



#### **CAMERON HAWORTH**

Senior Analyst, Reserve Bank of New Zealand

Cameron is a Senior Analyst at the Reserve Bank of New Zealand, a final year PhD candidate at the University of Auckland, and CFA level 3 candidate. He has helped develop the Reserve Bank's range of alternative monetary policy tools, including negative interest rate policy and the design and implementation of the Large Scale Asset Purchase (LSAP) programme. His economic research covers a range of monetary and macroprudential policy problems, including the links between asset bubbles and wealth inequality and how 'cautious expectations' affect policymaking. Cameron will be the manager of the University of Auckland's Case Programme in 2024, training undergraduate students to analyse complex business problems and compete internationally.



#### **DIEGO VILLALOBOS ALBERU**

Principal Economist, Te Komihana Tauhokohoko - Commerce Commission

Diego studied Economics and Public Policy in Barcelona, Toulouse and Chicago. After working at Ofgem, the British energy regulator, he moved to New Zealand to work at Te Komihana Tauhokohoko - Commerce Commission, where he applies the insights from economics to make New Zealanders better off. His work is focused on regulating natural monopolies, such as electricity lines companies (like Vector), fibre companies (like Chorus) and airports (like Auckland airport), so that the prices they charge to consumers — and the quality that they deliver — approximate those we would expect if competition existed in these sectors.

Andrew is joint Deputy Dean of the Faculty of Business & Economics, and a Professional Teaching Fellow in the Department of Management and International Business. Andrew joined the Faculty in 2014. His specialist areas are conflict resolution, negotiation, employment relations, general management, and teaching & learning. Natalie is the Law and Business Te Ūnga Kairuruku Recruitment Adviser within the Schools and Commmunity Enagement Team for the University of Auckland. She studied Psychology and Sociology at the University of Auckland and has worked in student services ever since, helping guide tauira through their journey of higher education. Coming from a previous role in Unievrsity of Auckland Student Hubs, Natalie's speciality knoweldge is in degree planning, support services and course advice for any University of Auckland degree. **PRASANNA GAI** MPhil, DPhil Professor | Head

Prasanna is Head of the Department and Professor of Macroeconomics at the University of Auckland, His work, which applies ideas from network and game theory to understand the causes and consequences of financial crises, has been published in leading journals, including The Review of Financial Studies, Economic Journal, Journal of Monetary Economics, Journal of International Economics, and the Proceedings of the Royal Society (A). Professor Gai is also the author of two books on financial crises and systemic risk, both published by the Oxford University Press. He holds a Doctorate and a Master of Philosophy (Economics) from Christ Church, Oxford, and a Bachelor of Economics (Hons) from the Australian National University. He serves on the Board of the New Zealand Financial Markets Authority, is a Senior Research Fellow at the Deutsche Bundesbank, Frankfurt, an Academic Adviser to the Bank of Canada, Ottawa, and a Fellow of the National Institute of Social and Economic Research (NIESR), London, Britain's oldest independent economics thinktank. In 2019, he delivered the A.W.H. Phillips Lecture to the New Zealand Economics Association, Professor Gai was formerly at the Bank of England (1994-2007) and was a Professor of Economics at the Australian National University (2008-10).



**STEFFEN LIPPERT** Diplom Volkswirt, PhD Associate Professor | Deputy Head

Steffen joined the Department in July 2014 as a Senior Lecturer. Prior to this, he was a Senior Lecturer in Economics at the University of Otago and at Massey University and a Postdoctoral Fellow at the Research Institute of Industrial Economics in Stockholm. He studied Economics at Mannheim, Berkeley, and Toulouse and received his PhD in Economics in 2005 jointly from the Toulouse School of Economics and Mannheim University. His research focuses on the Economics of Climate Negotiations, the Economics of Innovation, and the Economics of Social Interactions and Networks. Steffen currently serves as the Deputy Head of the Department of Economics and the Subject Area Leader in Economics



**HAIPING ZHANG** MA, MPhil, PhD Senior Lecturer | MADE Leader

Haiping Zhang is a Senior Lecturer at the Department of Economics, University of Auckland. Before coming to New Zealand, Haiping held positions as an Assistant Professor at the School of Economics, Singapore Management University, and a research fellow at Bonn University. He has a PhD from Bonn University in Germany. His research interests span three areas: international macroeconomics and trade, financial development, and innovation and endogenous technology adoption in the data economy. His work has been published in top field journals, and his commentary on trade and digital economy has appeared in media outlets like National Business Review
