#### Welcome to the New Zealand Economics Competition 2021 Awards presentation ceremony.

The New Zealand Economics Competition has grown in size and reputation since its inception in 1997 and has been administered by the Department of Economics at The University of Auckland Business School since 2008.

The Competition is the largest and most prestigious one of its kind for secondary school students. The fifty-minute examination paper contains fifty multiple-choice questions that test both classroom theory and general knowledge of current economic issues.

This year about 1500 students from 60 schools throughout New Zealand entered the Competition. Tonight is an opportunity to recognise some of the students who have achieved outstanding performances.

Commissioner,

John Small was appointed in December 2018 as Associate Commissioner and as a Commissioner in June 2020. John is the Founding Director of the Economic Consultancy firm, Covec, and was also the former Head of the University of Auckland's Economics Department. He has extensive experience undertaking complex competition analysis in a wide range of sectors, including energy, transport, agriculture, telecommunications, payment systems, and construction. John was also previously a lay member of the High Court of New Zealand, frequently called as an expert witness before courts, tribunals, and commissions. John is a member of the Commission's Commerce Act Division, Consumer Division, Fuel Division, and Market Studies Division. He is a member of the Board's Audit and Risk Committee.

#### DOMINICK STEPHENS

Deputy Secretary and Chief Economic Adviser, The Treasury New Zealand

Dominick Stephens is responsible for ensuring that the Treasury's policy advice on lifting New Zealand's living standards is supported and strengthened by sound economic theory and evidence. Dominick is on secondment to the Treasury from Westpac from March 2021 until the end of the year. He has been Chief Economist at Westpac New Zealand for the last decade, leading its team providing forecasts and research on the New Zealand economy. He is a respected analyst, adviser, and commentator on a range of economic and market issues, from housing policy to monetary policy and climate change. His responsibilities included membership of Westpac's Sustainability Steering Committee. He was formerly an Economist in the Reserve Bank of New Zealand's forecasting team and modeling unit. Dominick is from Christchurch and graduated from the University of Canterbury with a Bachelor of Science with Honours in Economics. Dominick is a keen tramper and ice hockey player and is fluent in Spanish, Finnish, and Portuguese.



#### SUSAN WATSON

Dean of the University of Auckland Business School

Professor Susan Watson is Dean of the University of Auckland Business School. She holds joint chairs in the Faculty of Law, and the Faculty of Business and Economics at the University of Auckland, and is Director of Governance at the Aotearoa Centre for Leadership and Governance. She researches and teaches primarily corporate law and corporate governance. Her research has been published widely in New Zealand and internationally. She has written and edited numerous books, treatises and articles and won the Legal Research Foundation Sir Ian Barker Published Article Award. She is a Research Member of the European Corporate Governance Institute (ECGI) - the only New Zealander to be appointed to date. She has been a visiting Professor at Vanderbilt University and Tilburg University, and a visiting academic at the Oxford Law Faculty. In 2020, Professor Watson was elected president of the Society of Corporate Law Academics (SCoLa).

**STEVEN POELHEKKE** MSc Utrecht, M Res PhD EUI Professor and Head

Steven Poelhekke is Professor of Economics and Head of the Department of Economics at the University of Auckland. He is also a research fellow at CEPR and CESifo in Munich. He previously worked at the Dutch central bank. His research interests cover International Trade and Investment and their intersections with Development and Environmental Economics. He has studied, among other topics: the local impact of mining on the tradeable sector, the persistence of foreign direct investment benefits for domestic firms in developing countries, and the effects of resource wealth and multinational banks on foreign direct investment. He is a Dutch national and holds a PhD from the European University Institute, Florence, Italy. He has published, among others, in the Review of Economics and Statistics, Journal of the European Economic Association, Journal of International Economics, Journal of Development Economics, and the European Economic Review. Columns and policy pieces have appeared on VoxEU.org and the LSE Business Review.



**ASHA SUNDARAM** BA Mumbai, MPhil Oxf., MA Ph.D. Syracuse Senior Lecturer and Deputy Head

Asha Sundaram is a Senior Lecturer at the Department of Economics, University of Auckland, Prior to this, she was a Senior Lecturer at the School of Economics, University of Cape Town, South Africa. She has an M.Phil in Economics from the University of Oxford, UK and a PhD from Syracuse University, USA. Her research spans the areas of international trade and development economics and exploits micro data to explore the impacts of globalization on labour markets and firms. She has been published in top field journals, general-interest journals and books published by Oxford University Press. She was a visiting research scholar at the Department of Economics, University of Michigan, Ann-Arbor (2014) and the Centre for Advanced Financial Research and Learning (CAFRAL), at the Reserve Bank of India. She has consulted for the World Bank, the Asian Development Bank, the Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East-Asia (ERIA) and research institutions like the Peterson Institute of International Economics (PIIE), Washington DC. Her commentary on trade and policy issues has appeared in media outlets like the New Zealand Herald, BBC news and Newshub.



**ERWANN SBAI** PhD Ut-capitole Senior Lecturer and Deputy Head

Erwann Sbai is Senior Lecturer in Economics and Deputy Head of the Department of Economics at the University of Auckland. His research interests cover theoretical and applied econometrics. It includes the development of identification and estimation procedures to characterise participants' behaviour in empirical games. Possible applications are Treasury Bonds auctions or electricity spot market. He has also collaborated with UoA colleagues, in particular in the field of experimental economics. He has published, among others, in Econometric theory, Journal of Applied Econometrics, Journal of Behavioral and Experimental Economics, and New Zealand Economic Papers.



**STEPHEN POLETTI** MSc ANU, PhD Newcastle upon Tyne, PhD Auckland

Senior Lecturer and Academic Coordinator of 2021 Competition Stephen Poletti is a Senior Lecturer in Economics and a member of the Energy Centre as the University of Auckland. His research area is Energy Economics and Industrial Organisation. He has also published papers in Theoretical Physics. Prior to joining the Economics department at Auckland he held a position as a postdoc in the department of Mathematical Physics at the University of Adelaide. Recent work includes a study of Market Power in the New Zealand Electricity market and the impact of Real Time electricity prices in a setting where firms have market power. He has published, among others in *Physics Letters B, Physical Review D, Energy Economics, Journal of Industrial Organisation, Energy Policy and Renewable Energy*
