BABC conjoint: A student may not major in both Employment Relations and Organisation Studies in the BA component and Management in the BCom component.

BCBS conjoint: A student in the Information Technology Management major for the BSc component cannot take both major in Business Analytics and Information Systems for the BCom component but could take either one or the other.

BCLB or BCLBH: A student cannot include any of the courses in the subject Commercial Law in the BCom component.

BCBEH: STATS 100/108 is not required for the BCom component of this conjoint and must be replaced with 15-points from the BCom Schedule.
