- · Look for those with a similar interest area and review the list of potential supervisors on the **Supervisor Register**
- · Send emails to potential supervisors in the Faculty along with your description of the research you would like to engage in
- · Once you have found a supervisor and are both happy with your proposal, please submit your research proposal online.
