Course structure

This programme includes a flexible self-paced online course, and an optional practical skills workshop designed to complement your learning.

- Learn at your own pace through four interactive online modules, exploring the definition of abnormal uterine bleeding, common causes, patient assessment, initial management, and referral pathways
- Each module includes engaging activities, clinical reflections, and a formative quiz to reinforce your understanding
- Expand your skills with an in-person workshop focusing on Pipelle endometrial sampling and LNG-IUS insertion
- Join a small, hands-on group led by experienced specialists who
 provide expert feedback and a final formative assessment to ensure
 you leave confident and competent; enjoy connecting with peers over
 morning tea.

What will you learn?

You'll gain the skills and confidence to assess, manage, and treat abnormal uterine bleeding in primary care, applying national guidelines and evidence-based strategies. By adding the in-person workshop, you'll also benefit from specialist-led training and peer interaction to deepen your understanding of this important area of women's health.

By completing the online modules, you'll be able to:

- Define AUB and its common causes
- Conduct thorough assessments including history, examination, and investigations
- Identify appropriate initial management options, from medical to surgical approaches
- Communicate risks, side effects, and benefits of treatment options clearly to patients
- Explain the processes and indications for endometrial biopsy and LNG-IUS insertion

Upon completion of the online course, you will be awarded a Certificate of Completion.

By additionally completing the in-person workshop you will:

- Be able to demonstrate the clinical skills needed for Pipelle biopsy and LNG-IUS insertion
- Be awarded a University of Auckland Digital Badge
