

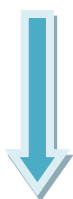
ADMISSION CRITERIA - PGDipHSc(Nuclear Medicine)

You are a registered Medical Imaging Technologist



Do you have a clinical training position in nuclear medicine in New Zealand*?

You may apply online to be admitted to the **PGDipHSc (Nuclear Medicine)** programme.

You will need to provide:

- evidence of your medical imaging qualification,
- your MRTB registration number,
- a completed University of Auckland Clinical Training Position Agreement

Once admitted to the **PGDipHSc (Nuclear Medicine)** programme you must apply to the Medical Radiation Technologists Board (MRTB) for registration in a Training Scope of Practice (Nuclear Medicine), providing evidence of your next semester's course enrolment.

*For those interested in pursuing a career in nuclear medicine and who are **NOT** Medical Imaging Technologists, please follow the process overleaf.*

You may apply online to be admitted to the **PGCertHSc (Medical Imaging)** programme.

You may begin your study[#] while you seek your clinical training position and may transfer your enrolment across to the **PGDipHSc (Nuclear Medicine)** once you have secured your clinical position.

Should this not occur before you have successfully completed four courses, you will be eligible to graduate with a completed qualification.

You may be eligible to transfer this qualification into the **PGDipHSc (Nuclear Medicine)** should you subsequently obtain your clinical training position within a period of 5 years.

You may apply online to be admitted to the **PGDipHSc (Nuclear Medicine)** programme.

You will need to provide:

- evidence of your qualification,

- a completed University of Auckland Clinical Training Position Agreement

You will need to gain a **Medical Imaging** undergraduate degree to be best placed to obtain a clinical training position in nuclear medicine and you will then be eligible to apply to the **PGDipHSc (Nuclear Medicine)**.

The **BMedImag(Hons)** qualification is offered by the University of Auckland. Students are selected from applicants who have completed:

- Year 1 of the Bachelor of Science at the University of Auckland, or the Health Sciences First Year at the University of Otago, or
- a relevant degree such as science, health sciences or biomedical science within 5 years.

Alternative undergraduate Medical Imaging degrees are offered in New Zealand by Unitec (Auckland), UCOL (Palmerston North) and Ara (Christchurch).

You may apply online to be admitted to the generic **PGCertHSc** programme. When applying for this programme, please select 'Health Sciences' as your specialisation.

You may begin your study while you seek your clinical training position and may transfer your enrolment across to the **PGDipHSc (Nuclear Medicine)** once you have secured your clinical position.

Should you not secure a clinical position before you have successfully completed four courses, you will be eligible to graduate with the completed **PGCertHSc** qualification.

You can credit some of this qualification into the **PGDipHSc (Nuclear Medicine)** should you subsequently obtain your clinical training position within a period of 5 years.
