# SAFE WORK INSTRUCTION

PORTABLE AIR COMPRESSOR

## PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT



Safety glasses must be worn at all times.



Safety footwear must be worn.



Hearing protection must be worn.



Close fitting / protective clothing must be worn.

# **POTENTIAL RISKS**

- (i) Unsecured hoses whipping under pressure.
- (i) Compressed air.
- (i) Blown dust and objects.
- (i) Noise.

#### DON'Ts

- Do not blow compressed air onto the skin or towards other people.
- Do not use air guns to clean clothing while it is being worn.
- Do not use faulty equipment. Immediately report suspect machinery to your supervisor.

## PRE-OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS

- Locate and ensure you are familiar with all machine operations and controls.
- Put the compressor in a suitable location for safe operation.
- Lock the wheels on the base of the compressor to prevent movement.
- Check workspaces and walkways to ensure you have not created any slip/trip hazards.
- Check that all fittings and connections are in good condition.
- Check all fittings are securely connected before being pressurised.

## OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS

- ✓ Start the compressor, noting pressure increase and cut-out/cut-in pressure.
- Listen for any air leaks from any flexible airlines and immediately report if any leaks are found.
- Adjust pressure regulator to suit work requirements.
- Check the compressor at regular intervals.
- When disconnecting pressurised hoses, grip the hose ends firmly, and direct any air away from the body.

## ENDING OPERATIONS AND CLEANING UP

- ✓ Switch off machine when work completed.
- Leave the machine, hose and work area in a safe, clean and tidy state.
