SAFE WORK INSTRUCTION

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT




Safety glasses must be worn at all times.



Safety footwear must be worn.



Long or loose hair must be contained.





Rings and jewellery must not be worn.

POTENTIAL RISKS

(i) Cutting through flesh and bone

Hearing protection

must be worn.

- (i) Potential abrading and tearing flesh
- (i) Hair/clothing getting caught in moving parts.
- (i) Snagging or shattering glass work piece
- (i) Cuts from broken glass
- (i) Excessive noise
- (i) Eye injuries.

DON'Ts

- Do not use faulty equipment. Immediately report any suspect machinery to your supervisor.
- Do not attempt to cut anything other than glass or ceramics.
- Never leave the machine running unattended.

PRE-OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS

- Locate and ensure you are familiar with operations and controls.
- Ensure all guards are fitted, secure and functional. Do not operate if guards are missing or faulty.
- Check workspaces are free of swarf and uncluttered.
- Visually inspect blade for defects and alignment.
- ✓ Adjust blade height and lock firmly in position.

OPERATIONAL SAFETY CHECKS

- Adjust appropriate coolant flow.
- Where possible hold work piece firmly against table or securely in a jig.
- ✓ Slide the work table forward applying gentle pressure against the blade.
- Rotate the work piece against the blade, keeping the depth of cut to a minimum.

ENDING OPERATIONS AND CLEANING UP

- Switch off the machine when work completed.
- Leave the machine in a safe, clean and tidy state.
- Clean the machine frequently to stop the build-up of aggressive grit and glass powder
- Maintain free movement of work table.
