## **RECRUITMENT UPDATE**

During December, recruitment seemed slow over the festive period. But with a **new year** means a **new goal** for C\*STEROID! We want to focus on ways to boost recruitment and ensure all our sites are aware of the multiple resources we have available to help with this.

We have C\*STEROID **brochures** available in ten different languages. Engaging with eligible women & whānau early is important and it can be useful to provide information at antenatal visits. Having information available in clinical settings also helps promote and raise awareness about the trial.

As well as written information, we have **videos explaining the trial** which can also be useful to share with eligible women. Engaging in our **investigators meetings** is also a great way to find out more information and updates about the trial. Another idea to boost recruitment in your site includes having a **local prize draw.** For example, the Auckland team collect names of staff members who have contributed towards C\*STEROID and draw a name each month to award a \$50 Prezzy card. To get in the draw, staff either have to complete a neonatal blood glucose measurement for an infant whose mother is in C\*STEROID or refer/encourage a woman's participation in the trial. Having small activities like this helps to keep staff engaged with the trial while promoting recruitment.



If you have any other ideas on ways to boost recruitment, we would love to hear from you! It is important we are able to educate staff and eligible women and their whānau about C\*STEROID so they are able to make an informed choice about participating in research.
