Human Health Research Week (a curated programme of approved short courses) is a new initiative at Waipapa Taumata Rau, University of Auckland. The primary aim of this initiative is to enhance the capabilities of, and address gaps in training for, human health researchers across the entire University. The initiative will also be open to health researchers outside the University.

1. Which topics will the short courses cover?

The HHRW is a work-in-progress with offerings being added over time. The HHRW aims to cover various aspects on human health research including (but not limited to): research ethics, design, execution, analysis, publishing and communication of findings, and engagement with key stakeholders.

2. Who is delivering the short courses?

Contributors are based at the University's Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences, Liggins Institute, and Faculty of Science.
