

# Tertiary Foundation Certificate - 2024 Entry Requirements to The University of Auckland

Minimum academic requirements for guaranteed entrance into undergraduate study from the Tertiary Foundation Certificate. Effective for students applying for entry to the University of Auckland in 2024.

Entry to a University of Auckland Bachelor's degree requires completion of the Tertiary Foundation Certificate with the minimum GPA, plus completion of the required pathway and subject(s) as relevant. Any additional programme requirements must also be met. Lower GPAs may be considered for some programmes, subject to the availability of places.
