Academic programme for exchange students	Exchange students are considered "non-degree" students and can take any course listed in the <u>Study Abroad Module Catalogue</u> . Exchange at Roehampton is only available to undergraduate students (no postgraduate for University of Auckland students).

Application	
Application procedure	Eligibility : Applicants must have a minimum of 2.8 on a 4.0 scale or equivalent.
	Students must receive a nomination from 360 international before applying to the University of Roehampton.
	The student will receive more information on how to apply for exchange at Roehampton from 360 once they have been nominated. An official academic transcript and a personal statement will be required for the application.

Course information	
Full-time study course load	Students can choose modules up to a maximum of 60 credits per semester, or 120 credits per academic year. 10 UK credits are considered equivalent to 3 US credits or 5 ECTS. 20 UK credits are considered equivalent to 4-5 US credits or 10 ECTS.
Course availability	The University of Roehampton offers a wide variety of classes across all departments to students on our Study Abroad Programme. Students can view and choose modules on the <u>Study Abroad Module</u> <u>Catalogue</u> . Students can choose classes that relate to their major, minor or general education as long as you meet any pre- or co- requisites.

Health and travel insurance	
Health insurance	 European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) Students studying and working in Europe will need to have a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). The EHIC can be used to cover any necessary medical treatment due to either an accident or illness within the European Economic Area (EEA). The EHIC must be valid for the entire stay abroad. For further information and to apply for an EHIC card for a study placement, visit the <u>NHS website</u>. This may not cover all of the services people would expect within the UK. The University strongly recommends that students also take out an additional insurance policy for their time in Europe.

Accommodation	
On-campus housing	All students on the Study Abroad programme are guaranteed housing in our on-campus halls of residence provided you apply by the deadline. Rooms are single occupancy study bedrooms with shared kitchen facilities, Internet connection and optional private bathrooms. The Roehampton Abroad team will apply for accommodation on your behalf.
