Description

The Prize was established in 1996 and is financed from a gift by Miss Alma Logan, for many years a teacher of Italian in Auckland, who communicated her enthusiasm for the language and culture of Italy to many students, young and old.

The main purpose of the Prize is to reward and encourage the study of Italian language and culture at Waipapa Taumata Rau, University of Auckland.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Cultures, Languages and Linguistics (or nominee)

Regulations

- 1. The Prize shall be known as the Alma Logan Prize in Italian Language.
- 2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$500.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded to the student enrolled in an undergraduate certificate, degree or diploma who has achieved the highest marks in ITALIAN 107 Italian Language for Beginners 2. As a minimum standard the student must have achieved at least an A- grade. In the event of a tie, the Prize will be awarded to the student who demonstrated the most progress as assessed by the marks achieved in ITALIAN 106 and ITALIAN 107.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Cultures, Languages and Linguistics (or nominee) in consultation with the Major/Specialisation Leader for European Studies (or nominee).
- 5. The Prize may not be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Award.
