Description

The Prize was founded in 1946 by subscribers to a fund set up for the purpose of preserving the memory of Dr. Arthur Robert Andrew, Dean of the School of Mines at the University of Otago from 1932 to 1941. The Prize was transferred to the University of Auckland in 1986.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee)

Regulations

- 1. The Prize shall be known as the Andrew Memorial Prize.
- 2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$2,000.
- 3. The Prize shall be awarded annually to the student who achieved the highest GPA over CIVIL 300 Geotechnical Engineering and CIVIL 301 Foundation Engineering. As a minimum standard, the student must have achieved a GPA of at least 7.00 (equivalent to an A- average).
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee).
- 5. In the event of a tie, the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee) shall determine if the Prize may be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council can amend these regulations provided there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
