Description

The Prize has been awarded since 2014 by the University of Auckland Clinics (UOAC) in memory of Miss Anna Pritchard, in recognition of her dedication to the advancement of teaching in optical dispensing (see Note I).

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise the student in the final year of the Bachelor of Optometry programme at the University of Auckland who has excelled in optical dispensing.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Optometry and Vision Science in consultation with the UOAC's Dispensing Opticians

Regulations

1. The Prize will be known as Anna Pritchard Memorial Cup.
2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$500. The name of the recipient will be inscribed on a commemorative cup displayed in the School of Optometry and Vision Science (see Note II).
3. The Prize will be awarded to a full-time student enrolled in the final year of the Bachelor of Optometry who has excelled in optical dispensing as assessed by the combined grades from the Optical Dispensing log book (or equivalent if another system is used), the Dispensing session marks, and the results in the Colour Vision/Dispensing assessment from the Semester Two course work in OPTOM 510 Advanced Clinical Optometry 1.
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Optometry and Vision Science (or nominee) in consultation with the University of Auckland Clinics' Dispensing Optician (or nominee).
5. The Prize may not be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if in any year there are no candidates of sufficient merit.
7. The University of Auckland Council has the power to amend or vary these regulations, in consultation with the School

of Optometry and Vision Science, provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
8. Notes [I]-[II] below are deemed to be regulations.

Notes

- I. These Regulations were approved in 2020. Any awards made prior to 2020 will not be recorded on academic transcripts.*
- II. The recipient of the Prize will also receive a miniature of the cup to keep.*
