Description

This Prize was established in 1990 in honour of Anne Webb who was a Lecturer, and later, Senior Lecturer in Commercial Law from 1973 to 1990.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Commercial Law

Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the Anne Webb Prize in Contract Law.
- 2. The value of the Prize will be \$500.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the student enrolled in a Bachelor of Commerce who achieved the highest mark in course COMLAW 201 Commercial Contracts. As a minimum standard, the student must have achieved at least an A- grade. In the event of a tie, the Prize will be awarded to the student who achieved the highest mark in the examination.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Commercial Law (or nominee).
- 5. The Prize may not be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined that there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
