Description

This Prize marks the Antarctic Conference held at the University of Auckland in 1990 to celebrate 150 years of exploration and science in Antarctica.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Biological Sciences

Regulations

- 1. The Prize shall be known as the Antarctica 150 Prize.
- 2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$500.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded to the student who achieved the highest overall marks in BIOSCI 100 or BIOSCI 100G Antarctica: The Frozen Continent. As a minimum standard, the student must have achieved at least an A- grade. In the event of a tie, the Prize will be awarded to the student who achieved the highest mark in the examination.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Biological Sciences (or nominee).
- 5. The Prize may not be shared.
- 6. The Prize shall not be awarded in a particular year if there is no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council has the power to amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
