## Description

The Prize was established in 1986 by a donor who wished to remain anonymous who had studied Asian History at the University.

## Selection process

---

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Cultures, Languages and Linguistics

## Regulations

---

1. The Prize will be known as the Asian History Prize.
2. The value of the Prize will be \$500.
3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the undergraduate or postgraduate student who, in the opinion of staff teaching Asian History courses, has demonstrated the highest level of commitment to the study of Asian History, as determined by factors including, but not limited to, the number of courses undertaken in the subject at undergraduate and/or postgraduate level, and the student's contribution and engagement in classwork.
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Cultures, Languages and Linguistics (or nominee) in consultation with the Major/Specialisation Leader for Asian Studies (or nominee).
5. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
6. The Prize may not be shared.
7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
