Description

This Prize arises from a fund given to the University of Auckland by the Auckland Town Planning Association in 1965 for the award of an annual Prize in Planning.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Head of the School of Architecture and Planning (or nominee)

Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the Auckland Town Planning Association Prize in Planning.
- 2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$500.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded to the student who achieved the highest mark for the URBPLAN 757 Research Project or URBPLAN 715 Dissertation. The dissertation or research project must have been submitted by the last day of the final term of enrolment in the dissertation or research project to be considered for the Prize. As a minimum standard the student must have achieved at least an A- grade. In the event of a tie, the Prize will be awarded to the student who has best demonstrated the learning outcomes identified in the respective course outlines.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Architecture and Planning (or nominee).
- 5. The Prize may not be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
