## Description

---

The Prize was established in 2019 and is funded by Barristers who operate out of Augusta Chambers, in recognition of the critical importance of evidence law in criminal and civil litigation.

The main purpose of the Prize is to reward and recognise the student enrolled in a Bachelor of Laws or Bachelor of Laws (Honours) who achieved the highest marks in LAWGENRL 401 Evidence.

## Selection process

---

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law

## Regulations

---

1. The Prize will be known as the Augusta Chambers Prize in Evidence.
2. The Prize will be of the value of \$1,500.
3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the student who achieved the highest marks in LAWGENRL 401 Evidence or an equivalent course in either Semester One or Semester Two. As a minimum standard, the student should have achieved an A- grade.
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law (or nominee).
5. In the event of a tie, the Dean of the Faculty of Law will determine whether the Prize may be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
