Description

The Prize was established in 2019 and is funded by Buddle Findlay.

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise and reward the student enrolled in a Bachelor of Laws or Bachelor of Laws (Honours) who obtained the highest marks in LAW 241 Law of Contract.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law

Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the Buddle Findlay Prize in Contract Law.
- 2. The Prize will be of the value of \$1,000.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the full-time student who achieved the highest marks in LAW 241 Law of Contract. As a minimum standard, the student should have achieved an A- grade.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law.
- 5. In the event of a tie, the Dean of the Faculty of Law will determine whether the Prize may be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council has the power to amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if in any year there are no candidates of sufficient merit.
