## **Description**

This Prize was established by Dr R G McElroy, a former Pro-Chancellor of the University of Auckland, to encourage the study of Administrative Law.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council, upon the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law

## Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the Dr R G McElroy Prize in Administrative Law.
- 2. The value of the Prize will be \$1,000.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded to the student with the highest mark in LAWPUBL 401, provided that the highest mark results in a grade not less than A-.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council, upon the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law.
- 5. If (a) LAWPUBL 401 is not taught, or (b) no student in LAWPUBL 401 achieves a grade of at least A-, the Prize may be awarded to the student with the highest mark in LAWPUBL 426 Judicial Review.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council will not be bound to award the Prize in any year if there is no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. In the event of a tie, the Dean of the Faculty of Law will determine if the Prize may be shared.
- 8. The University of Auckland Council has the power to amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
