Description

Founded in 1955 by Mr G. W. Eaton Turner, a graduate of the Otago School of Mines, at the University of Otago for students in the fourth year of their degree course. The purpose of the Prize is to encourage students to cultivate style, clarity and precision in writing. The Prize was transferred to the University of Auckland in 1986.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee)

Regulations

- 1. The Prize shall be known as the G. W. Eaton Turner Prize.
- 2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$1,000.
- 3. The Prize is awarded annually to the student completing Part IV of a Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) in Civil Engineering who submitted the best project report in CIVIL 705 Research Project. As a minimum standard the student must have achieved at least an A- grade.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee).
- 5. In the event of a tie, the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee) shall determine if the Prize may be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
