## Description

---

The Gordon Harris Art Supplies Prize was originally established in 2000 by Gordon Harris Art Supplies and rewarded a student enrolled in the Bachelor of Fine Arts degree. These regulations were amended in 2011 to include an additional prize for a student enrolled in the Master of Fine Arts.

The main purpose of the Prizes is to value and support new and emerging artists engaging in the practice of painting.

## Selection process

---

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prizes will be awarded each year by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Head of the Elam School of Fine Arts

## Regulations

---

1. The Prizes will be known as the Gordon Harris Art Supplies Prizes.
2. Two Prizes will be awarded to the value of \$500 each (in vouchers).
3. One Prize will be awarded annually for the most meritorious painting work submitted for examination by a student enrolled in their fourth year of study for the degree of the Bachelor of Fine Arts or the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Honours). The second Prize will be awarded for the most meritorious painting work submitted for examination by a student enrolled in the Master of Fine Arts degree at Elam School of Fine Arts.
4. The Prizes will be awarded each year by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Head of the Elam School of Fine Arts (in consultation with a representative from Gordon Harris Art Supplies).
5. In the event of a tie, the Head of the Elam School of Fine Arts shall determine if one or both of the Prizes may be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council has the power to amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prizes.
