## Selection process

---

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Humanities

## Regulations

---

1. The Prize will be known as the Haydon Prize.
2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$500.
3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the student majoring in History at either undergraduate or postgraduate level who has achieved the highest mark in courses or research relating to the history of Empire or the history of a Commonwealth nation. As a minimum standard, the student must receive an A- grade. In the event of a tie, the Prize may be awarded to the student demonstrating the highest commitment to the subject as determined by factors including, but not limited to, the number of courses taken in the subject at undergraduate and/or postgraduate level, and the student's contribution and engagement in classwork.
4. A student who has been awarded the Prize previously shall not be eligible to receive this Prize again.
5. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Humanities (or nominee) in consultation with the Major/Specialisation Leader for History (or nominee).
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
7. The Prize may not be shared.
8. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
