

# Hollinrake Memorial Prize

## Description

The Prize was established in 1957 as a result of a public conscription organised by the Auckland Music Council in memory of the late Professor Horace Hollinrake, who was Professor of Music at the University of Auckland from 1935 to 1955.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Music (or nominee)

## Regulations

1. The Prize shall be known as the Hollinrake Memorial Prize.
2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$500.
3. The Prize will be awarded to the Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of Music conjoint or a Bachelor of Arts majoring in Music student who achieved the highest grade point average (GPA) across the three Classical Theory and Musicianship courses MUS 203, MUS 204 and MUS 205. In the event of a tie, the candidate's cumulative GPA and contribution to the life of the University may be taken into consideration.
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Music (or nominee).
5. The Prize may not be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
