Specific Terms of the Scholarship

1. Scholarship description

- (1) The objective of the scholarship is to provide financial and mentoring assistance to first year BE(Hons) students who have participated in either the [Women in Engineering Academy Programme](#) and/or the [Apollo Programme](#).
- (2) A recipient must use the scholarship funds for costs directly related to their study at the University.
Note: To avoid doubt, costs directly related to study include living expenses to enable study.
- (3) The terms of the scholarship comprise sections 5 to 23 of the Scholarships and Prizes Statute 2025 ([Statute](#)), these Specific Terms, and any requirements stated on the application form or stipulated in writing by the Director.
Note: The term “scholarship” includes an award.

2. Commencement and term

- (1) The scholarship will commence in Semester One in the year of award. The Director may approve a request by a recipient to defer the commencement of the scholarship for a period specified by the Director if the Director considers there are compelling medical reasons or adverse personal circumstances beyond a recipient’s control.
- (2) The scholarship is for a term of one year. The Director may approve a request by a recipient to suspend the scholarship after it has commenced for a period specified by the Director if the Director considers that there are compelling medical reasons or adverse personal circumstances beyond a recipient’s control.

3. Scholarship value

- (1) The scholarship comprises: up to \$10,000 paid in two equal instalments in Semester One and Two.

4. Eligibility criteria

The eligibility criteria for the award are that an applicant must:

- (a) be a New Zealand Citizen or Permanent Resident; and

Note: New Zealand Permanent Residents have been granted a [Permanent Resident Visa](#) by Immigration New Zealand.

- (b) be enrolled in Year 13 at a New Zealand secondary school or kura as of the scholarship application closing date; and
- (c) have participated in either the [Women in Engineering Academy Programme](#) and/or the [Apollo Programme](#); and
- (d) intend to enrol full-time in a BE(Hons) or BE(Hons) conjoint degree at the University in the year directly after completing secondary school or kura.

Note - See section 6 (Eligibility criteria) of the [Statute](#).

5. Selection process and criteria

- (1) The scholarship is granted by the Vice-Chancellor after receiving a recommendation from the Selection Committee.
- (2) The Selection Committee comprises three academic staff members from the Faculty of Engineering and Design nominated by the Associate Dean Academic of the Faculty of Engineering and Design, of whom one must be either the Women in Engineering Project Manager or the Apollo Project Manager (or their nominees).
- (3) Normally, one scholarship will be awarded to an applicant who participated in the [Women in Engineering Academy Programme](#), and one scholarship will be awarded to an applicant who participated in the [Apollo Programme](#).
- (4) The selection criteria for the grant of the scholarship are:
 - (a) academic ability based on results achieved at Year 12 in Level 2 or higher in the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA), or CIE, or IB, or an equivalent qualification; and
 - (b) the applicant's active engagement in the [Women in Engineering Academy Programme](#) and/or the [Apollo Programme](#), and commitment and desire to study engineering as assessed by a personal statement.
 - (c) financial need as determined by the applicant's eligibility for a StudyLink Student Allowance and personal financial circumstances as assessed by a personal statement.
 - (d) consideration may be given to the following criteria: the donors interest in:
 - (i) increasing the number of Māori students in engineering; and/or
 - (ii) increasing the number of women in engineering; and/or
 - (iii) supporting students who live, or who attended secondary school or kura, in a rural area.

6. Additional conditions of grant

The additional conditions of grant under section 9(1)(c) of the Statute are:

- (a) Applicants who have been awarded a scholarship must accept their offer by the date stated in the awarding notification, otherwise the scholarship offer will be forfeited.
- (b) If a recipient enrolls at another tertiary institution in New Zealand or overseas, the scholarship will be forfeited.

7. Admission and enrolment

- (1) A recipient must achieve admission to the BE(Hons) or a BE(Hons) conjoint degree programme.
- (2) A recipient must receive confirmation of enrolment in accordance with section 10(1) of the Statute and be enrolled full-time in an applicable programme, and all tuition and other fees must be paid in accordance with section 10(1) of the Statute by the final date on which a student may add or delete courses without incurring a late enrolment fee.
- (3) Where a recipient has been directed to enrol in a Bachelor of Science, the Faculty of Engineering and Design will consider them for admission to the BE(Hons) in Semester Two through the [Alternative pathway via the Faculty of Science](#).

8. General requirements

During the term of the scholarship, a recipient must: remain enrolled full-time in the applicable programme.

9. Concurrent scholarships

- (1) A recipient may only hold the scholarship concurrently with any other scholarship, award, grant, or bursary granted (or to be granted) to the recipient by the University or another organisation if the requirements of section 14(1) of the Statute are met and with the approval of the Director.

10. Applications

Applications must be made using the online application portal on the Scholarships Office webpage.

11. Definitions

- (1) A word that is defined in section 23 (Definitions) of the [Statute](#) has the same meaning when used in these Specific Terms.

These Specific Terms come into force on 28 August 2026.
