Description

The Prize was established in 1986 by the Auckland Goethe Society as a tribute to Professor J A Asher for his work on the staff of the University of Auckland since 1943, and on the occasion of his retirement after holding the Foundation Chair in German from 1962 to 1986.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Cultures, Languages and Linguistics (or nominee)

Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the John Asher Prize in Stage I German.
- 2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$250.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the student who achieved the highest marks in GERMAN 102. As a minimum standard, the student must have achieved at least an A- grade. In the event of a tie, the Prize may be awarded to the student with the highest aggregate marks over GERMAN 101 and GERMAN 102.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Cultures, Languages and Linguistics (or nominee) in consultation with the Major/Specialisation Leader for European Studies (or nominee).
- 5. The Prize may not be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations, provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
