Description

The Prize was established in 2015 and is given in memory of Judge Avinash Deobhakta by his daughter, Kavita Deobhakta BA LLB (Hons) and his son-in-law, Sadesh Natali BHSc PGD (HSc).

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise and reward the student achieving the best grade in Criminal Procedure.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law

Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the Judge Avinash Deobhakta Memorial Prize in Criminal Procedure.
- 2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$1,500.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the student enrolled full-time in a Bachelor of Laws (LLB), LLB(Hons) or associated conjoint degree who achieved the highest mark in LAWPUBL 430 Criminal Procedure. As a minimum standard the student must have achieved at least an A- grade.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law (or nominee).
- 5. In the event of a tie, the Dean of the Faculty of Law shall determine if the Prize may be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
