Description

The Scholarship was established in 2016 and is financed by the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences.

The main purpose of the Scholarship is to support international students to develop leadership capabilities for the health sector and further their careers in health management, health care quality improvement, international health management and health leadership in their communities by enrolling into the Master of Health Leadership at the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences.

Selection process

- A Selection Committee assesses potential candidates
- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Scholarship is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Selection Committee

Regulations

1. The Scholarship will be known as the Master of Health Leadership International Student Scholarship.
2. Up to two scholarships will be awarded, each for the duration of the programme and will be of the value of up to \$15,000 each, paid as a contribution towards compulsory tuition fees (see Note I).
3. International students will be considered for the award of a Master of Health Leadership International Student Scholarship at the time of application for admission to a Master of Health Leadership in the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences at Waipapa Taumata Rau, University of Auckland. Students who have commenced study in a Master of Health Leadership are not eligible for consideration for these scholarships. A grade point average (GPA) or grade point equivalent (GPE) of at least 5.00 in the most recent qualifying programme is required for Scholarship consideration (see Note II).
4. The Scholarships are tenable by full-time full fee paying international students (see Note III).
5. The basis of selection will be academic merit (see Note II). The country of origin of the candidate may be considered

- by the selection committee to align with the University's strategic aims.
6. The Scholarships will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of a selection committee comprising the Associate Dean Postgraduate of the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences (or nominee), the Associate Dean International of the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences (or nominee) and the Academic Services Manager of the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences (or nominee).
 7. The Scholarship will be paid as a contribution towards compulsory fees of up to \$5,000 per Semester (see Note I).
 8. To be paid the second and subsequent instalments, the awardee must remain a full-time full fee paying international student and must successfully pass each semester of the programme.
 9. The Scholarship may be held concurrently with any other scholarship, award or grant as long as the regulations for that scholarship, award or grant permit and the University of Auckland Council is informed and approves. It is the responsibility of the awardee to declare to the Scholarships Office all other scholarships, awards or grant funding received and for which the awardee receives payment while also in payment for this Scholarship.
 10. The University of Auckland Council, in consultation with the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences, has the power to terminate or suspend a Scholarship if it receives a report of unsatisfactory progress by a Scholar from the Associate Dean Postgraduate of the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences.
 11. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
 12. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these Regulations, in consultation with the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences, provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Scholarship.
 13. Notes [I]-[IV] below are deemed to be regulations.

Notes

- I. Compulsory fees are those only related to the relevant programme of study, plus Student Services Fee.*
- II. The most recent qualifying programme is defined as the most recently completed programme of study that qualifies the applicant for entry to the masters programme for which they are applying.*
- III. International students are students who are neither citizens, permanent residents nor resident visa holders of New Zealand or Australia.*
- IV. Awardees will be required to comply with the regulations for the Scholarship and must notify the Scholarships Office of any change in their enrolment or funding status. Waipapa Taumata Rau, University of Auckland may, in the event that it can be established that an awardee is not complying with these regulations, terminate the Scholarship and require repayment of the funds received from the date of the breach.*
