## **Description**

The Prize was established in 1987 with donations from OSM graduates for the purpose of preserving the name of the Otago School of Mines (1879-1987) which was incorporated into the Department of Civil & Resource Engineering at the University of Auckland.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee)

## Regulations

- 1. The Prize shall be known as the Otago School of Mines (OSM) Prize.
- 2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$1,000.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded to the Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (BE(Hons)) or BE(Hons) conjoint degree student who achieved the highest marks for CIVIL 722 Slope Engineering. As a minimum standard, the student must have achieved at least an A- grade.
- 4. The Prize shall be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee).
- 5. In the event of a tie, the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee) shall determine if the Prize may be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
