## Description

---

The Prize was established in 1987 with donations from OSM graduates for the purpose of preserving the name of the Otago School of Mines (1879-1987) which was incorporated into the Department of Civil & Resource Engineering at the University of Auckland.

## Selection process

---

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee)

## Regulations

---

1. The Prize shall be known as the Otago School of Mines (OSM) Prize.
2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$1,000.
3. The Prize will be awarded to the Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (BE(Hons)) or BE(Hons) conjoint degree student who achieved the highest marks for CIVIL 722 Slope Engineering. As a minimum standard, the student must have achieved at least an A- grade.
4. The Prize shall be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee).
5. In the event of a tie, the Head of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (or nominee) shall determine if the Prize may be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
