Description

The Prize was established in 2018 and is funded by the Pharmaceutical Society of New Zealand (PSNZ).

The main purpose of the Prize is to stimulate interest in pharmacy studies along with personal and professional leadership development, and service contributions among Part III students in the Bachelor of Pharmacy degree at the University of Auckland.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Selection Committee

Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the Pharmaceutical Society of New Zealand Leadership in Pharmacy Studies Part III Prize.
- 2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$500.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the student enrolled in Part III of a Bachelor of Pharmacy (BPharm) degree who best demonstrated evidence of personal and professional leadership qualities in advancing the activities and understanding of pharmacy studies with other health professionals, health professionals-in-training and/or consumers as evidenced in their collected portfolio submitted at the end of Part III of the BPharm (see Note I).
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of a Selection Committee comprising the Head of the School of Pharmacy (or nominee), the Associate Head (Academic) of the School of Pharmacy (or nominee), and a representative of the Pharmaceutical Society of New Zealand (PSNZ).
- 5. The Prize may not be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council, in consultation with the donor, can amend or vary these regulations provided that

there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.

8. Note [I] below is deemed to be a Regulation.

Notes

I. The portfolio will comprise a reflective statement of not more than 500 words that demonstrates the student's understanding of what personal leadership and professional pharmacy leadership means to them, supported by evidence drawn from the student's Pharmacy ePortfolio and other relevant additional evidence which may include submitted coursework.
