## Description

The Prize was established in 2007 and is financed by the Pharmacy Guild of New Zealand.

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise the graduating student with the highest level of achievement overall across Parts II-IV of the Bachelor of Pharmacy or Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) degree.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Head of the School of Pharmacy

## Regulations

1. The Prize will be known as the Pharmacy Guild Prize.
2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$750.
3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the student who has met the requirements to graduate with a Bachelor of Pharmacy (BPharm) degree or Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) (BPharm(Hons)) degree in the year of the award with the best overall performance across Parts II-IV of the BPharm or BPharm(Hons) degree as determined by cumulative grade point average (GPA) (see Note I). As a minimum standard the student must have achieved a GPA of at least 7.00.
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Head of the School of Pharmacy (or nominee).
5. The Prize may not be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these Regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
8. Note [I] below is deemed to be a Regulation.
