## Description

The Prize was established in 1968 by an annual grant from Potter Industries Limited.

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise merit in aspects of undergraduate and postgraduate study in Architecture.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council after receiving a recommendation from the Head of the School of Architecture and Planning

## Regulations

1. The Prize will be known as the Potter Interior Systems Ltd Prize in Architecture.
2. Two Prizes will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$1,000 each.
3. The Prizes will be awarded for outstanding work in the field of architectural construction. One Prize will be awarded to the most outstanding student in Part III of the Bachelor of Architectural Studies, and one to the most outstanding student in Part I of the degree of Master of Architecture (Professional). As a minimum standard, the students must have achieved an A- average.
4. All students who are enrolled for a full-time programme in the appropriate Part will be eligible for a Prize.
5. The Prizes will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Architecture and Planning (or nominee).
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations, with the consent of Potter Interior Systems Ltd, provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
