Description

The Prize was established by subscriptions from past and present students, associates and friends, as a tribute to Professor Robert McDonald Chapman on his retirement in 1988 after holding the foundation Chair in Political Studies since 1964.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize shall be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Social Sciences (or nominee)

Regulations

1. The Prize shall be known as the Robert Chapman Prize in Politics and International Relations.
2. The Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$1,000.
3. The Prize shall be awarded to the first year Bachelor of Arts (BA) or BA conjoint student majoring/specialising in Politics and International Relations in the School of Social Sciences who achieved the highest marks in an introductory course in New Zealand politics in the year of the award. As a minimum standard the student must have received an A-grade.
4. The Prize shall be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Social Sciences (or nominee) in consultation with the Major/Specialisation Leader for Politics and International Relations (or nominee).
5. In the event of a tie, the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Social Sciences (or nominee) shall determine, in consultation with the Major/Specialisation Leader for Politics and International Relations (or nominee), if the Prize may be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate who meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.

7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
