Description

The Award was established to assist students in their second year of Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) studies.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Award is made by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering and Design (or nominee)

Regulations

- 1. The Award will be known as the Robert Horton Engineering Award.
- 2. One Award will be made annually and will be of the value of \$1,500.
- 3. The Award will be made to the student enrolled in Part II of a Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (BE(Hons)) who achieved the highest grade point average (GPA) across all Part I courses in the proceeding year. As a minimum standard, the student must have achieved a GPA of at least 7.00 (equivalent to an A- average).
- 4. The Award is tenable by domestic or international students.
- 5. The Award will be made by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering and Deisgn (or nominee).
- 6. In the event of a tie, the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering and Design (or nominee) will determine whether the Award may be shared.
- 7. The Award will be paid in Semester One, as soon as is practical after confirmation of the awardee's enrolment (that is, after the final date on which a student may add or delete courses without incurring a late enrolment fee).
- 8. To be paid the Award, the awardee must be enrolled full-time in Part II of a BE(Hons).
- 9. The Award may be held concurrently with any other scholarship, award or grant as long as the regulations for that scholarship, award or grant permit and the University of Auckland Council is informed and approves. It is the responsibility of the awardee to declare to the Scholarships Office all other scholarships, awards or grant funding received and for which the awardee receives payment while also in payment for this Award.
- 10. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that

- meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 11. Payments under the terms of this Award remain tax-free as long as they are used for the payment of costs associated with an awardee's programme of study and/or to assist the awardee with living costs while studying (see Note I). Failure to comply with this regulation will result in the termination of the Award.
- 12. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Award.
- 13. Notes [I]-[II] below are deemed to be Regulations.

Notes

- I. The tax-free status of this Award is under current legislation. The University of Auckland cannot guarantee this tax-free outcome.
- II. Awardees will be required to comply with the regulations for the Award and must notify the Scholarships Office of any change in their enrolment or funding status. Waipapa Taumata Rau, University of Auckland may, in the event that it can be established that an awardee is not complying with these regulations, terminate the Award and require repayment of the funds received.
