Description

This Prize was established in 1982 to commemorate the association with the Department of Physics of Mr Seiichi Waki who, at the time of his death, was a student of the University engaged in research for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Physics.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Physics

Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the Seijchi Waki Prize.
- 2. The Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$500.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the student enrolled in a masters programme in Physics who, subject to Regulation 4, achieved the highest grade in a masters thesis. As a minimum standard, the student must have achieved at least an A- grade. In the event of a tie, the Prize will be awarded to the student whose thesis is deemed to make the biggest contribution toward the field of research.
- 4. The Prize will not be awarded conjointly with the Sagar Geophysics Prize.
- 5. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Physics (or nominee).
- 6. The Prize may not be shared.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council will not be bound to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 8. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
